Federal stimulus funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) on projects that improve the quality of the public housing communities.

The Housing Authority is fortunate to have these funds available to not only enhance the public housing communities, but to also put people to work. Be on the look out for new fences in Sierra Vista Homes, kitchen and bathroom remodels in Conway and Tracy Homes, storage shed replacements in Thornton Homes, and tree maintenance in all of the communities.

Administration Highlight

In February 2009, Congress passed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) at the urging of President Obama, who signed it into law four days later. A direct response to the economic crisis, ARRA has three goals:



- Create new jobs and save existing ones
- Spur economic activity and invest in long-term growth
- Foster unprecedented levels of accountability and transparency in government spending

The Housing Authority of the County of San Joaquin was the recipient of \$2.8 million in ARRA funds. To date, the Housing Authority estimates that 44 jobs have been created by ARRA-funded projects. The jobs created represent the workers and contractors carrying out the rehabilitation projects in the Public Housing Communities.



Ms. Thelma Johnson, a resident in Buthmann Homes, provided a recipe that her daughter-in-law invented called "Jeri's Lazy Cake." **ENJOY!**

Jeri's Lazy Cake (serves 3)

Ingredients:

| 1/2 cube butter | 1/3 cup milk |
| 1/2 cup Bisquick | 1 pint canned fruit (including juice) |
| 1/3 cup sugar | |



Preheat the oven to 400°. Melt the butter in a bread pan in the preheating oven. Once the butter has melted, remove bread pan from the oven. Combine Bisquick, sugar and milk, then mix with butter. Pour canned fruit, juice and all, on top of batter. Bake for 30-35 minutes or until brown on top. To double the recipe for 6 servings, use an 8" or 9" square pan.

Spring Safety Tips



The following are some Spring Safety Tips for walkers, runners, and bicyclists:

- Bicyclists should travel with traffic, obey the rules of the road, and always wear a helmet.

Maintenance Moment



Blocked sinks and drains are frustrating to everyone and are easily avoidable. Food waste, food scraps, or cooking grease/oil put down the sink or flushed down the toilet are common causes for clogged drains. Instead of going down the drain, these items should be thrown away in the trash.

Tip for Residents: To help keep sink drains clean, place a tablespoon of baking soda in the drain followed by a cup of water to wash it down. Not only will it help keep the drains clean, it is also environmentally-friendly!

IT'S IN OUR HANDS

The Census is a count of every person residing in the United States. The count includes people of all ages, races, ethnic groups, citizens and non-citizens. Federal law protects the personal information shared during the Census.

The information collected is used to distribute Congressional seats to states, to make decisions about what community services to provide, and to distribute \$400 billion in federal funds to state and local governments each year.

PHA Plans

On an annual basis, a PHA (Public Housing Agency) Plan is developed by the Housing Authority and submitted to HUD. The PHA Plan contains information about how the Housing Authority manages the public housing communities.

A big part of the PHA Plan process is resident participation.

The PHA Plan process provides residents with an opportunity to get involved, ask questions, and discuss important issues.

Information about upcoming Public Meetings regarding the PHA Plan Update will be distributed to residents. All residents are encouraged to attend the Public Meetings to provide input as to what is important to the residents and how proposed changes may affect residents.
